There is no fee required of the student.

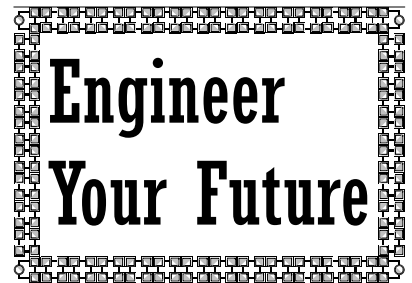
